 AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TORRANCE ESTABLISHING CERTAIN TRAFFIC CONTROL MEASURES PURSUANT TO ARTICLE IV, ORDINANCE NO. 486.

The City Council of the City of Torrance does hereby order as follows: That public convenience and no other purpose be established on certain streets in said City.

NOW THEREFORE IT IS HEREBY ORDERED by the City Council of the City of Torrance that the following regulatory traffic signs be established on the following streets:

- Two-way STOP on:
 (a) Cota Avenue at Engracia Avenue;
 (b) Haines Avenue at Engracia Avenue; and
 (c) Hawthorne Blvd. at 244th Street.
- NO PARKING AT ANY TIME:**
 (a) On both sides of Anacis Avenue between driveways and median buildings and Torrance Boulevard.

The aforementioned regulatory signs have been determined by the Traffic Commission as necessary, by Ordinance No. 486, of the City of Torrance, and the City Traffic Chief, under said Ordinance and Article is hereby authorized to direct the placement of such signs.

The City Council hereby declares that the increased usage of these signs mobile driving public of these streets and to the absence of such signs demands the immediate preservation of public peace, health and safety of all citizens traveling said streets, whether by automobile or as pedestrians, and best interests of the community upon the aforesaid statement, declares that an urgency exists and that this Ordinance shall take effect and be in full force immediately after the passage and adoption hereof.

The City Clerk shall certify to the passage and adoption of this Ordinance and cause the same to be published once in the Torrance Herald, a semi-weekly newspaper, printed and circulated in the City of Torrance, and said newspaper to hereby designated for that purpose.

 AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF TORRANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 625 BY ADOPTING A SCHEDULE OF HEATING AND VENTILATING IN CONNECTION WITH THE ISSUANCE OF PERMITS FOR THE INSTALLATION OF HEATING AND VENTILATING CODES OF THE CITY OF TORRANCE.

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Torrance has heretofore adopted the Heating and Ventilating Code of the City of Torrance, as incorporated in the 1947 edition of the Uniform Plumbing Code, as the official heating and ventilating code of the City of Torrance; and

WHEREAS, no schedule of fees for use in connection with the issuance of heating and ventilating permits was adopted; and

WHEREAS, it is the desire of the City Council of the City of Torrance to amend Ordinance No. 625 of the City of Torrance by adopting a schedule of fees for use in connection with said Ordinance No. 625;

NOW, THEREFORE, the City Council of the City of Torrance does ordain as follows:

- Subsection (a) of Section 55.203 of the Torrance Heating Code is hereby amended to read as follows:
 (a) Fees Schedules: The fees for any permit, as required by Section 55.203 of this Code, shall be as follows:
 1. \$1.00—for issuing each permit.
 2. \$1.00—for the installation or replacement of each warm air furnace, plus:
 3. \$0.25—for each warm air outlet of a warm air heating system, in excess of four such outlets, plus:
 4. \$1.00—for the installation or replacement of each warm air heater and floor furnace, plus:
 5. \$1.00—for the installation of each combustion products vents other than a chimney, complying with the requirements of the Building Code, plus:
 6. \$0.50—for the repair, replacement or alteration of each combustion chamber or heat exchanger of any warm air furnace or warm air heater, plus:
 7. \$2.00—for each blower or exhaust fan serving any ventilating system and which is separate from and apart from any warm air furnace or warm air heater, plus:
 8. \$1.00—for the alteration, repair or replacement of each warm air heater or warm air heating system, which alteration, repair or replacement costs more than \$100.00 for labor and material.
- EXCEPTION—A supplementary permit may be issued upon payment of a fee which shall be the difference between the fee required for the original permit and the fee which would have been required had the original permit included the entire installation, repair or alteration.
- Double Fees: Whenever any person shall commence any erection, installation, alteration, repair or replacement of any heating or ventilating equipment regulated by this Code, in violation of Section 55.203 thereof, such person shall be subject to payment of double the fees as specified in subsection (a) of this section for each such violation, in addition to such double fees shall not exempt such person from compliance with all other provisions of the Code, nor from any other penalty provided for violations thereof.
- Subsection (c) of Section 55.203 is hereby added to read as follows:
 (c) Refrigeration Fees: The fees for any refrigeration installation shall be as follows:
 1. \$1.00—for issuing each permit, plus:
 2. \$1.00—for each 100 pounds of refrigerant, or fraction thereof, in excess of the first 90 pounds, plus:
 3. \$2.00—for each refrigerant compressor, plus:
 4. \$2.00—for the alteration or replacement of any portion of a refrigerating system.

Sec. 3.
 This Ordinance is hereby declared an urgency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, general welfare and continued progress of the City of Torrance, the fees regulated hereunder constituting a considerable revenue to the City of Torrance. This Ordinance, therefore, upon its passage and adoption, be in immediate force and effect.

The City Clerk shall certify to the passage of this Ordinance and shall cause the same to be published once in the Torrance Herald, a semi-weekly newspaper of general circulation published in the City of Torrance, California.
