A close friend of Dr. Charles E. Fuller of the national wide broadcast, "Old-Fashioned Revival Hour," Dr. Vom Bruch was master of ceremonies at the program's 23rd anniversary of continuous broadcasting. He has been used greatly by the Spirit of God throughout the length and breadth of this country as a human instrument through whom He has worked in mighty power," according to Rev. Northrup. "He preaches the truth fearlessly and presents the Gospel faithfully, giving expression to natural wit and humor in sermons which are full of passionate earnestness and fire. He appeals to the intellect, the reason, and the will," said the reverend.

### Fays Tribute

Dr. Vom Bruch also pays a wonderful tribute to his mother, which will be a challenge to every mother, the reverend continued. Northrup quoted him as saying: "God gave me the most wonderful mother in the world. She raised us four boys in the West Side, 'gunman's paradise,' of Chicago. Saloons, shows, dens of iniquity and vice were on every hand, yet she saw her four boys grow to manhood and enter Christian work. Mother taught us to keep our brains clear and our blood clean. She then pointed us to the Lamb of God whose power alone would enable us to do so, and we found Him sufficient."

The evangelist will be assisted by the Rev. Everett Mills, known as the "Children's Friend." The coming of these men promises to be one of the greatest events in the religious life of Torrance, Rev. Northrup said.

## Keystone Baptists To Start New Church

Groundbreaking ceremonies for the new \$80,000 Keystone Baptist Church will be held this afternoon at 355 W. 220th St. under the direction of Rev. W. I. Lowe, pastor.

Dr. Charles McLain, pastor of the Truett Memorial Baptist Church of Long Beach, will bring an inspirational message and a quartet from his church will sing. The Brummel quartet and leaders of Southern Baptist churches of the area will be on hand also, Rev. Lowe reports.

At a special morning service, Rev. C. A. Butler, a missionary of the Home Missions Board, will bring the message, and at the 7:30 p.m. services, Dr. E. W. Beasley, of the Negro Fellowship Center, will speak. He will also bring a quartet to appear during the services, according to Rev. Lowe.

Rev. McDowell has been vicar of the Church of the Holy Communion since August, 1950, during which time a church and parish house has been built. Rev. McDowell is a native of California and has received both his college and seminary training in this state. He was ordained to the priesthood in February of 1951.
