Urge Housewives To Save for 'Salvage Week'

Torrance housewives are urged to think of the Salvation Army when disposing of castoff articles uncovered in closets and garages during spring cleaning. These articles will be sought by the Salvation Army during the annual Salvage Week campaign here April 13-18, Chairman J. Hugh Sherkey Jr. pointed out. Reconditioned in workshops of the Salvation Army Social Service Center which serves this area, the materials will make possible a social rehabilitation program which aids needy and handicapped men. Brigadier Ranson D. Gifford, manager of the center, said discards last year provided 285,000 hours of work therapy, \$9,632 meals, 21,110 lodgings and substantial financial aid. By helping men who otherwise would be compelled to seek county or state aid, the non-profit organization lessens the tax load, the Salvation Army leader said. He reported that the center has continuing need for discarded but still usable clothing, furniture, bedding, dishes, shoes, toys, stoves, radios, appliances, bric-a-brac, bicycles, rugs, rags and miscellaneous items. Chairman Sherkey urged Torrance residents to telephone 3834 to bring a Red Shield truck to home or office to collect discards during the campaign. A special fleet of the trucks will operate here.

Basin Water Conservation Zone Asked

The executive committee of the West Basin Water Association decided at a recent meeting to request again that the Board of Directors of the West Basin Municipal Water District ask the Board of Supervisors to initiate proceedings to form a water conservation zone in West Basin under the Los Angeles County Flood Control District. It was decided that a zone should be formed to provide funds, beyond the state allocation of \$750,000, for the continuation of the West Basin barrier test, which is an attempt to create a permanent fresh water barrier against salt water intrusion into the Basin. Under the water conservation zone plan, funds would be raised through levy of a five cent ad valorem tax on property benefited by the zone program. It has been estimated that the West Basin zone would have an assessed valuation of about \$450,000,000. This means that the five cent levy would provide about \$225,000 per year to be expended in purchase of water to be used in creating the barrier against salt water intrusion.

Children's Shop Slates Opening

Scheduling a grand opening "just in time for Easter," is Debbie's Children's Shop, at 1114 Crenshaw Blvd. The new store, owned and operated by Edith Dahlen, will celebrate its opening today, tomorrow, and Saturday, March 26, 27, and 28. Named Debbie's after the owner's little daughter, the shop is located next door to Mari Lyn Dress Shop. It will feature complete clothing for infants through five years old. A child's Easter gift will be given to the first 50 parents visiting the shop tomorrow, Friday.

VFW to Plant Tree Sunday

Members of VFW Post 3251 and its auxiliary will plant and dedicate a tree to the City of Torrance next Sunday afternoon at Plaza del Amo and Arlington Ave. as part of a nationwide program of VFW. The tree, which will later bear a plaque with the inscription, "Stop and Pray for World Peace," will be accepted for the city by Mayor Mervin M. Schwab, a VFW spokesman said yesterday. The public ceremonies will begin at 2 p.m.
