(Continued from Page 1) Everything was going right for him. And yet, in his other life everything seemed to go wrong.

Consequently, Sperry had a hard time holding a job. When he was feeling all right, he worked well and was, as Bill Eytchison described him, "a great salesman, with a terrific personality."

Because he did not want anyone to know about his wartime injury, Sperry did not apply for an Air Force pension. Eytchison said, "Then because he was put on probation for writing bad checks he couldn't get back into the Air Force."

His "Death flight" accomplished one important thing — it brought out to the public the fact that Roland Sperry needs hospital attention, and now he will get it.

Despondent, he threatened suicide and, on at least three different occasions, tried to take his own life. He attempted to hang himself in the basement of the Eytchison home but Bill Eytchison discovered him in time and talked him out of it.

Eytchison brought out the fact that, on his suicide flight, Sperry was trying to hurt nobody but himself. "He didn't try to ram anyone. He wasn't that kind of a guy," Eytchison said.

All of Sperry's friends are helping him get back on the road to a healthy, happy life. Art Eytchison, Bill's father, who owned the airplane that he took up, refused to file charges of Grand Theft, Airplane, and wants to help Sperry in every way.

Why did Roland Sperry change his mind and decide to land? Something happened to him while he was up in that plane. Up there in the peaceful sky, Roland Sperry had time to think. Gone were the constant pressures and strains that assailed him on the ground—he felt the freedom of air, wind and sky.

A psychiatrist would probably attribute Roland Sperry's trouble to his head injury in the war. All of the symptoms point out the fact that he was not always responsible for his actions and that he needs hospitalization.

Isabel, his fiance, put it this way—"Roland needs hospitalization, he shouldn't be prosecuted." Sperry himself, usually reluctant to talk of doctors or hospitals to his friends, had applied in private for admission to a veterans hospital, but it was full. He was put on the waiting list and waited for two years, with no results.
