A request for a water conservation zone in the West Basin was delayed temporarily by a decision of the executive committee of the West Basin Water Association recently.

His committee will outline the progress made to date in efforts to rescue the basin from further salt water contamination and will submit plans for safeguarding the ground water supply under the zone program.


