

Churches Slate Easter Services

Central Church Easter Program Told by Pastor

From the very beginning of Christianity, Easter was such a holy experience that a new day of the week—Sunday—was used to remind Christians of the resurrection, according to Rev. Homer H. Miller, pastor of the Central Church.

"It is impossible for us to overemphasize the true spiritual significance of Easter," he says.

With the realization that Easter has a divine message for all Christians, he said, the Central Church has arranged a program of services throughout this week which one needs to prepare for the message of Easter.

In order that member and friends of the church may be able to get the most out of Easter this year, Rev. Miller has invited them to attend services during the week. Tonight—the time coinciding with The Last Supper, Rev. Miller will conduct a candlelight communion service. The sermon will be entitled "Lord, Is It I?" Tomorrow evening he will speak on "Pontius Pilate, a Coward."

Easter Sunday, Sunday School will be conducted with W. E. Bowen, superintendent, in charge. At the worship service at 11 a.m., the pastor will speak on the subject "An Easter Journey." Members will be received into church fellowship at this service.

The rites of baptism will also be observed.

New Mormon Church Opens

Bishop Edwin M. Wheat, of Torrance, will preside over all of the Easter meetings, beginning with a priesthood meeting at 9 a.m. At 10:45 a.m. a Sunday school Easter program will be held and at 6:30 p.m. the Ward Choir will present an Easter cantata.

"Glass" partitions separate the chapel and recreation hall in the new building, and can be opened to accommodate a large group at a chapel service.

Wallach to Speak in Redondo Sun.

Theodore Wallach, of Chicago, will speak on the subject "Christian Science: The Availability of Unlimited Good" at the First Church of Christ, Scientist, in Redondo Beach, on Easter Sunday at 3 p.m.
