Economy Run Route Told by Sponsors


Eagerly awaited by 26 entrants and hundreds of key technicians of the automotive industry, announcement of the course for the 1953 Mobilgas Economy Run to Sun Valley, Idaho, April 20-23 was made jointly last week by the American Automobile Association and its affiliate, the Automobile Club of Southern California.

Labeled "top secret" for the past four weeks, the route was revealed with the removal of a sealed envelope containing the vital information from the vaults of the Auto Club.

At that time, all cars which will participate in the rugged economy test were in final impound and unable to engage in practice runs.

Through Four States
The 26 competing automobiles will travel over an official Economy Run course of 1206.1 miles which will take them through four states—California, Nevada, Oregon and Idaho.

Two overnight stops will be made—the first at Reno, Nev., and the second at Boise, Ida. At Reno, the cars will be impounded at the University of Nevada campus. The Boise impound area will be on the grounds of Boise Junior College.



Participants in the famed economy marathon will leave Los Angeles early on the morning of April 20 from the General Petroleum garage at Eighth and Flower Sts. Their first destination will be Reno via Baker's Field, Fresno, Stockton, Sutter Creek, and Placerville in California and Carson City in Nevada.

From Reno, the cars will proceed to Winnemucca, Nevada, thence north through the south east corner of Oregon and Jordan Valley to Boise. The last automobile.

Traffic Death Ruled Not A Suicide Try

Police have ruled out the possibility of suicide on the part of a Torrance man who stepped into the path of a car and was killed Monday evening.

The pedestrian, Harvey Lancaster, 65, of 22607 S. Vermont Ave., was killed almost instantly when he was struck by an auto driven by Thomas W. Mackay of Long Beach. The driver was not held.

Compton police said that no threat of suicide had been discovered and that the coroner suggested that no inquest be held. Lancaster was apparently trying to flag the auto down, and was not seen by the driver until too late. A witness backed up the driver's testimony that he did everything possible to avoid hitting the man.

The accident occurred in front of 915 E. 223rd St., Dominguez. Lancaster was pronounced dead on arrival at Harbor General Hospital and his body was taken to Cartwright's Mortuary in Wilmington.
