



LARRY ROY ERASES SCHOOL VAULTING RECORD BY GOING OVER 12FT. 3IN.

Jack Dean's 1948 Vault Mark Falls

Torrance vaulter Larry Roy erased a five-year-old school vaulting record as he soared over the cross bar at 12 ft. 3 in. after eliminating all competition in the event here Friday afternoon in a dual meet with Mira Costa High of Manhattan Beach.

Roy's new mark bested the 12 ft. 1/4 in. mark set by Jack Dean in 1948 while vaulting in Class B competition. Dean's mark still stands as a Class B record at school.

Roy missed his first two tries at 12 ft. 1/4 in. then cleared it easily on his final jump. After that, he had no trouble up to 12 ft. 3 in. He failed to make the 12 ft. 4 in. jump.

Slow times were turned in on the track events because of the breeze which faced distance runners on the backstretch of the track, and because of the soft, sandy track.

Torrance won every varsity event except the 100-yard dash, and Al Rainwater pushed his Michi opponent so close that it was hard to separate them at the finish line.

Torrance likewise won all the Class B events except the shot put, and it won every Class C event from the young Michi squad.

Only one more meet remains before the Bay League Prelims start on May 1. Next Friday, April 25, the Tartar squad will travel to Beverly Hills for its final dual meet. The League preliminaries will be held at El Camino May 1 and the finals the following week.
