### 'Greene Buck' Auction Slated For Drive-In



The railroad circus will set up tents at 220th St. and Border Ave. for an afternoon and evening performance under the auspices of the Torrance Optimist Club.

The tented city will be the scene of performances at 3 p.m. and at 8 p.m. on Wednesday, April 29.

For the season of 1953, Beatty has surrounded himself with a host of new and sensational foreign acts.

Though many of these acts are making their first appearance in the United States and are outstanding stars of the circus world, the wild animal display of Beatty is still the big thrill of the two-hour performance.

**New Lions Imported**  
New lions and tigers, recently imported from the jungles and


