

Summer Session Data Released By El Camino

Advance information concerning the 1953 summer session at El Camino College was released yesterday by William H. Harless, director of instruction.

Courses in the summer session, which is to begin July 1 and run through Aug. 13, will include many in each of the three major areas of the college: the business and industry division, the humanities and fine arts division, and the science and engineering division. Registration for summer courses will be held on July 1 and classes will begin July 2, Dr. Harless said.

In the business and industry division, some of the courses to be offered will include beginning and advanced shorthand, office machines, cosmetology, vocational drafting, and police administration during the daytime. In the evening, other courses in this division will include beginning and advance accounting, beginning economics, law, business psychology, small business management, personnel management, salesmanship, comptometry and typing. Other vocational courses to be offered include auto mechanics, furniture making, general blueprint and industrial welding.

In the humanities and fine arts division, the following evening courses will be given: child psychology, philosophy, creative writing, literature, beginning drawing, developmental reading, general psychology, English, history, and political science. In the day program many of these same courses are to be offered, including physiological psychology.

In the science and engineering division, many of the regular semester courses will be given during the abbreviated summer session, and will include: biology, chemistry, engineering drawing, geography, hygiene, home-making, algebra, geometry, trigonometry, and physics.

One Fifth Leads To Another, Says Highway Patrol

About one-fifth of the state's traffic accident troubles can be blamed on the drinking drivers, the California Highway Patrol noted recently.

A new report covering a 12-month period shows that drivers who had been drinking figured in about 20 per cent of the total number of fatal and injury accidents in which a similar percentage of the total injuries and deaths occurred.

On the basis of provisional figures for 1952, this means that such drivers were responsible for about 725 deaths and more than 20,000 injuries last year.

The "had been drinking" classification, the Patrol said, includes drivers obviously drunk and those "under the influence."

Men are overwhelmingly the worst offenders, the Patrol said. Out of slightly more than 14,000 "had been drinking" drivers involved in fatal or injury accidents, 92 per cent were men.

Ages of drinking drivers involved in accidents ranged from under 19 to over 65, the Patrol said, although most of them came from the 25-34 age group with the 35-44 bracket running second.


