Jordan powerful cinder men almost took a full sweep of first places in the Marine League track finals held at Narbonne High School last Friday afternoon.

A new Marine League record was set by Dan Everage, a junior at Jordan, who broke the old shot-put standard of 53ft. 4 1/2 in. with a mighty heave of 56 ft. 4 1/2 in. *
San Pedro's Don Shinnick was a close second.

Freddie Ackenback, San Pedro's ace miller, wrestled a very close race from Narbonne's Bob Dreyer with a time of 4:41.4.

Two Moores, one from Narbonne and the other from Jordan, were tied at 12 ft. in the pole vault.

Jordan's sturdy relay team had very little trouble placing first in the mile and was timed at 3:06.5.

There were five places in this meet and all the finalists will vie at the Coliseum in the City Preliminaries and Finals.

With an overwhelming score of 90 3/4, Jordan's Bulldogs came out on top. The other schools and their scores are: Gardena, 34; Narbonne, 25; San Pedro, 18 3/4; Banning, 10 1/2; and Westchester, 1.

New \$65,000 Fishing Boat At Redondo Pier

Torrance fishermen will have one more deep sea fishing boat at their disposal this week.

The new 65-foot "City of Redondo," recently completed at a Terminal Island shipyard, goes into service today as a half-day boat operating from Redondo's Fisherman's Wharf, according to an announcement from Gordon McRae, head of the Redondo fleet.

The new Diesel-powered craft will go into service as a half-day boat, said McRae, leaving Monday Pier at 7:30 a.m. and 12:30 p.m. daily.

With room for 90 anglers to fish from its decks, the new \$65,000 craft is the largest on the California coast, McRae claimed.

Addition of the City of Redondo to the Redondo fleet brings to three the number of sport fishing boats headquartered at that city's wharf. In addition, three near-shore barges and two piers provide facilities for hundreds of fishermen. Two barges are already in operation and a third will be brought around the point from its San Pedro anchorage next week.
