**After Week Delay Mendez Performs For 900 Audience**

Well healed from a case of hives which prevented his first scheduled performance, Rafael Mendez, the "Heifetz of the Trumpet," appeared as guest artist with the Torrance Area Youth Band Monday night at the Civic Auditorium and thrilled a full house audience of approximately 900 people with his superb trumpeting.

A blistered lip, result of a sudden attack of hives, prevented Mendez from appearing on May 19, his original performance date.

Faithful fans who waited a week, heard Mendez play "The Mexican Hat Dance," "Macarena," "Tico Tico," and "Mendez Czardas," one of his own compositions. He and his two sons joined in playing "Chilapaneas" and the Mendez Polka.

The Youth Band presented two numbers arranged by Lucien Calliet, well-known conductor and arranger. Titles were "Lady of Spain" and "An Italian in Algiers." Clarence Barwill, director of bands for the University of California at Los Angeles, conducted the band in "His Honor March," the "Hansel and Gretel" overture, "March of the Toys," and Ravel's "Bolero."

The concert was under the direction of James Van Dyck, conductor.

**New Hearing Set On 'Hot Potato' Rezoning Issue**

Although it isn't expected to cool off much in the meantime, the city's latest "hot potato"—the matter of rezoning of 55 acres from industrial to residential, was postponed Tuesday night until June 23.

Donald Armstrong, attorney for the developers of the proposed tract, asked for the continuance shortly after Mayor Schwab opened the hearing on the matter at Tuesday night's council meeting.

Protesting the continuance on the grounds that the hearing had been duly advertised and that it would be an inconvenience to reappear were representatives of the Santa Fe Railroad, L. J. LeRoy and J. G. Starkey.

Sylvester Morning, one of the partners in the firm which seeks to build homes on the 55-acre plot, said they intended to erect "nice, three-bedroom homes" on the land and wanted time to prepare for the council the plans and briefs on their development.

Starkey averred that a large New York realty firm which had negotiated the property on which the Chrysler building is now located as well as that on which the United Nations is erected, is "looking over" industrial land in Los Angeles County. He said they were looking at the 55-acre tract involved as well as a piece of land "east of here" and that if the council indicated it was going to juggle the zoning of the property they would probably pick up the other piece of property.

Councilman Nick Drale moved the matter be set over until the fourth Tuesday in June. The matter carried 4 to 0. Councilman Willys Blount was not in attendance.

**Beach Police Nab Young Pair**

A Torrance youth was jailed by Manhattan Beach police Tuesday night on suspicion of auto theft and suspicion of violating the Health and Safety Code after he and a Lawndale teenager were picked up as they were receiving a push to get the auto started.

Arrested were Jack Eugene Bishop, 20, of 22929 Berendo Ave., Torrance; and Gary Cooper Locke, 19, of 4302 W. 147th St., Lawndale. Locke was driving the allegedly stolen auto, Bishop was his passenger.

Bishop received the Health and Safety Code charge after officers said witnesses saw him toss a pack of benzadrine tablets underneath the auto.

**Chapel to Seek Congressional Seat of Poulson**

Assemblyman Charles Chapel of Inglewood, who represents the beach area of Torrance and the Beach cities, let it be known yesterday that he would be available to take over Congressman Norris Poulson's seat in the House of Representatives when Poulson resigns.

Chapel made his announcement after the election of Poulson to succeed Fletcher Bowron as mayor of Los Angeles was assured.

Poulson told reporters yesterday that he would resign his Congressional post immediately. He takes over as mayor of Los Angeles on July 1.
