Completion of the 180 by 300 ft. steel structure, which will supplement existing Douglas hangars and flight testing facilities located one-half mile east on Imperial, was announced recently by the El Segundo Division of Douglas Aircraft Co. Designated as Douglas El Segundo Hangar B-4, the building has two stories of offices at each end, a 40-by-300 ft. mezzanine with elevator in center bay, and floor space to accommodate up to 20 Skyray planes simultaneously.
