Local Teacher Pays For Life by Donating Blood to Red Cross

How much blood does one have to give to pay for one's life? That's the question asked by Alan S. Moore, physics and modern science teacher at Torrance High School who will start on the road to his second gallon of blood when the Red Cross Bloodmobile visits the Civic Auditorium on Monday, Feb. 8, 1954.

"The Red Cross literally saved my life when I was overseas during World War II, and giving blood is my way of trying to pay back the debt I owe," he said. "But, as far as I'm concerned, no matter how much blood I give, I can never repay it."

Council PTA Hears: Three Million Dollar Bond Issue Needed For New Classrooms

Torrance Council PTA executives got a word picture of the coming \$3,000,000 school bond issue and viewed colored slides of the Torrance Dental Health Association's work when they met last Tuesday at the Board of Education office.

Dr. J. H. Hull, superintendent of city schools, explained the many problems involved in providing sufficient classrooms for the children of Torrance following a report of the bond issue presented by the legislation chairman, Mrs. Duane Sherwood.

Dr. Hull went on to say that Torrance must have federal aid in its school construction program. He praised the Board of Education for its foresight in procuring large future sites for schools, saving many thousands of dollars by so doing, and urged PTAs to spread the message in order that "we might build schools to educate our children."
