

### Manuscribers Will Get Shot In Writing Arms

Professional writers who need an occasional push toward their typewriters will find Tom Gaddis, guest speaker at Southwest Manuscribers' February meeting, a shot in their writing arms, according to the publicity chairman.

Gaddis, himself a professional of wide repute, will discuss "Psychology and the Writer" at Clark Stadium Friday, Feb. 19, at 8 p.m. He will demonstrate how the writer can use psychology to keep in motion as a means of averting the occupational "slump" common to creative workers.

Gaddis is well qualified both in teaching writing and at actual production.

He has taught writing courses for more than five years under auspices of the Adult Education Department at Hollywood Evening High School, Los Angeles High School, and currently at

Fairfax Evening High School. His short stories and articles frequently appear in national publications ranging from pulps to slicks, with a full-length book pending publication.

A second feature of the evening's program will be submission of short-short stories in a membership-wide contest.

Manuscript subjects are unrestricted, but stories must be 1500 words or less, submitted under pen names with real name in a sealed envelope accompanying the script. Paid-up members who have not sold a short-short for the past five years are eligible for the cash awards to be made at the March meeting, according to Maurice Ogden, president.

Judging the competition will be Nancy Williams, Polly Booth, and Thomas W. May.

Membership in Southwest Manuscribers is open to all persons, professional or interested in becoming professional writers from Torrance, the South Bay, and surrounding areas.
