

Dedication Week To Begin Lenten Season at Church

Members of the Community Methodist Church of Waveria will join with fellow Methodists throughout the country in observing a week of dedication as the Lenten season begins, according to the church pastor, Gene M. Gehres.

The special week will be Feb. 28 to March 7 and services will be held at 11 a.m. and 7:30 p.m. on both days. A service also will be held on Wednesday evening, March 3, at 7:30.

Purpose of the week of dedication is the deepening of the spiritual life of members of the congregation as the Lenten season begins, the pastor said.

A free will offering will be taken to provide for urgent needs in the church's mission fields at home and overseas, with special priority to be given to a fund to bring Crusade scholars from other countries to study in the United States.

On Monday, March 1 at 7:30 a.m., the newly-organized Methodist Men's Club will receive its charter at its third meeting, to be held in the church, according to J. A. Beasley, president of the club. The meeting will be open to the ladies, Beasley reported.

St. and Manuel Ave., according to the Rev. C. Miles Northrup pastor.

Dr. Jauncey is an English-born Australian who has been engaged in evangelistic and Bible Conference work in this country since 1948. The early part of his life was spent on pioneer farms in the Australian bush where as the oldest of 15 children he learned from hard experience what the struggle for

survival means in primitive conditions, the Rev. Northrup said. College education came as a reward for success in competitive scholarship examinations. As an adequate background for the Christian ministry he took bachelor degrees in Arts, Science and Divinity and proceeded to graduate with degrees in each of these. Shortly after the outbreak of the war he was called from the pastorate to undertake special technical missions for the Australian government and at the close of the Pacific War was appointed as head of the Department of Science and Mathematics at Kings College, Adelaide. During these years, Dr. Jauncey became widely known as a lecturer, preacher and educationist, the pastor reported.

Comes to U. S. Experience in this country commenced as a teaching fellow at the University of California at Berkeley and included further graduate work at the University and Divinity School. Educational work involved 18 months at the Bible Institute of Los Angeles before taking up his present appointment. He is qualified to practice as a clinical psychologist holding an associateship in the British Psychological Society, and is a fellow in the Royal Geographical Society.


