You've Heard of Head-on Car Crashes -- Here's A New One

Practically anything can happen in traffic, as Frank Stivers, 37, of 621 Pine Dr., found out on his way to work shortly after midnight Thursday.

Half way to work, Stivers stopped casually for a red light at 190th St. and Vermont Ave. Then things started to happen. In fact, the roof caved in—literally.

A speeding car, driven by John T. Reed, a navy man stationed in Long Beach, knocked over a street light standard and flipped, rolling over on its top over the top of Stivers' car and then landing on its wheels in the middle of the intersection. Stivers crawled, unhurt, out of his crushed car but Reed required hospitalization at the Terminal Island Naval dispensary for cuts. Reed's car was listed as a total wreck.

Feature of the 1954 circus, of course, is the appearance of world-famous Clyde Beatty and his tigers, lions, and other wild animals.






