

Events for 'Public Schools Week' Told

With Open House scheduled at all schools, Public Schools Week will get under way in Torrance Monday.

Events at each school are specially designed to let parents become acquainted with the teachers and the school.

This is the 35th year that schools in California have observed Public Schools Week and in recent years, the idea has spread to Hawaii, Arizona and Texas and plans are under way to inaugurate a similar observance in Oregon and Colorado.

Following is the schedule of events for each school:

Walteria School


