Summer Opening Set for New EC Commerce Bldg

When summer school opens at El Camino College on July 1 commercial students will meet for classes in a new building.

Announcement that the building passed final inspection of the school board was made this week by Carl G. Arfwedson, director of finance at El Camino. The new structure was built under the supervision of Harry LeBeau, general superintendent for the Hahn-St. John Construction Company. The building inspector for El Camino is P. E. McWilliams.

Built to harmonize with the low California modern design of the college, the Commerce building will feature radiant heating from the ceilings, something new in junior colleges. The plaster and asphalt tiling also fits into the general color scheme.

All furniture will be installed shortly, and heat and electric service will be ready prior to the summer program. The Commerce Building, located near the corner of Greenwich and Redondo Beach Boulevards, is adjacent to the Administration Building. Scheduled for erection in the near future is a new Music-Theatre Arts Building, which will also be built in the southeastern sector of the El Camino campus.

Local residents will be enabled to view the new Commerce building at first hand on May 21, 22, and 23, when the college sponsors its annual Open House, Artwedson announced.
