

King Feted at AFL Luncheon, Hailed for Employment Levels

For his work in keeping production up and unemployment down in this area, veteran Congressman Cecil R. King has been honored by both labor and industrial groups in less than a week. During a flying visit from his Washington office, King was feted at a luncheon by officers of the AFL and at a reception attended by industrial leaders from more than 20 major firms in the 17th Congressional District.

The Congressman won "the greatest reception ever given him during a visit home," reported Jack Dabbs, Torrance businessman and member of the King Campaign Committee. "Few Congressmen have been paid higher tribute in their home districts."

The important labor and industry meetings were only two of many, Dabbs emphasized. He said: "Over 5000 King admirers visited spontaneous affairs honoring the Congressman. He received accolades from all important political action groups, and in most instances was given a standing ovation."

The distinguished California Congressman also was feted by Republicans for King clubs, Democratic Party clubs, youth groups, veterans groups, the Citizens for King, and at a luncheon given by 175 prominent socialites in the district.

Dabbs attributed the heavy King support to: 1. King's services to the district in keeping employment levels high.
