Bishop To Visit Episcopal Church

The Right Rev. William P. Remington, retired suffragan Bishop of Pennsylvania, will administer the sacrament of confirmation to 20 persons Sunday evening at 8 o'clock at St. Andrew's Episcopal Church.

Sponsors of those to be confirmed will introduce them into the organizations of the parish. The confirmands have received three months of instruction from the Rev. A. E. Bello, rector of St. Andrew's, prior to confirmation.

A reception in the parish hall will follow the service. In the Episcopal Church, confirmation is administered only by a bishop in apostolic succession. The sacrament dates back to apostolic days and has been administered by bishops of the Episcopal Church for more than 1600 years, or ever since Christianity was established in England.


