

## Your Child Poor in Reading? Summer Course May Help

If your child has not kept pace with the requirements of his class in reading ability, remedial reading may be the answer to your problem.

So said Mrs. Leona Prudence, press chairman, yesterday in announcing a new Compton Counseling Service class, a six-week summer course in remedial reading to begin Monday, June 22, and continue through Friday, July 31.

First session of the course, to be held at 10:30 a.m. at the Service headquarters in Compton, will be a mothers conference to acquaint parents with the purpose and program of instruction. The following Tuesday, tests will be given to children beginning at 9 a.m. to determine their reading ability and type of problem.

One-hour classes beginning at 9 a.m. will then be given five days each week, Monday through Friday.
