Howard Rumsey, veteran modern jazz bassist, and his Lighthouse All Stars, will present a jazz concert in the Torrance Theater at 8 p.m. on Monday, June 22. Rumsey is starting his fifth year in Hermosa Beach at the Lighthouse, where the "House of Jazz" presents Rumsey's jazz group six nights weekly for listening only. Rumsey entered the professional musical field back in the days of "Swing" and has played with Stan Kenton, Freddie Slack, Charlie Barnett, and also in theaters all over the country with the Johnny "Beet" Davis orchestra.

Joining with Rumsey will be Shelly Manne, drums; Shifty Rogers, trumpet; Jin Ginfiro, tenor sax; Bob Copper, tenor sax; Russ Freeman, piano, and Rumsey on the bass.

Nesuhi Ertegan, jazz critic who conducts a class at UCLA in this history of jazz, considers this group of "most outstanding example of the modern sounds on the west coast. The band will play many of its latest recordings.

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
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
