The duty of the Guam-based squadron, a branch of the Air Weather Service, is to collect data on general weather conditions, violent tropical storms, and typhoons of the Southwest Pacific. Flying over thousands of trackless miles of ocean — so that warnings can be made to ships at sea, military installations, and inhabited land areas, over which the storms may pass. Information derived from these storms have saved countless lives and thousands of dollars of equipment in the Korean war. Airman Riggs attended Torrance High until June 1950 and joined the Air Force in April, 1951. He was assigned to this overseas squadron in the latter part of 1951. A1C Hal Riggs has been awarded the Korean Service Ribbon and the United Nations Service Ribbon.
