

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TORRANCE ESTABLISHING CERTAIN TRAFFIC CONTROL MEASURES PURSUANT TO ARTICLE IV, ORDINANCE NO. 448.

The City Council of the City of Torrance does ordain as follows:

That public convenience and necessity require that traffic control installations be established on certain streets as follows:

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED by the Council of the City of Torrance that the following regulatory traffic signs be established on the following streets:

- Four-way STOPS:
(a) At 34th Street, Lane and Linda Drive.
- Two-way STOPS:
(a) On Torrance Boulevard across roads at Maple Avenue.
- One-way STOPS:
(a) On Sunset Avenue, Sandycroft Avenue, Redburn Avenue and Warden Avenue at Palms Verde Boulevard.
(b) On Danny Boyer Avenue, West Road at Newton Street.
- NO PARKING AT ANY TIME:
(a) On the west side of Ocean Street between 20th and 21st Streets.
- NO FOUR PARKING:
(a) In the center of Cabrillo Avenue between Gramercy Avenue and Carson Street.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TORRANCE ESTABLISHING A LICENSE FEE FOR THE SALE OF FIREWORKS WITHIN THE CITY OF TORRANCE AND REPEALING AN ORDINANCE INCONSISTENT HERewith.

WHEREAS, the City of Torrance formerly provided for the sale of fireworks within the City of Torrance, and the City Council of the City of Torrance does ordain as follows:

SECTION 1: It shall be unlawful for any person to use, possess, or discharge any fireworks of whatever kind or nature, in the City of Torrance at any time.

SECTION 2: It shall be unlawful for any person, firm, or corporation to sell fireworks within the City of Torrance without having first applied for, and received, a license to do so.

SECTION 3: There shall be established as an annual license fee for the sale of fireworks within the City of Torrance, the sum of One Thousand Dollars (\$1000), plus a license fee of Twenty-five Dollars (\$25) for each stand in excess of one, provided, however, that no person, firm, or corporation shall, within the City of Torrance, operate more than 112 stands.

SECTION 4: The obtaining of any such license as hereinabove provided the applicant or applicants, therefor shall first submit the location of each stand for what a permit is sought to the Chief of the Fire Department and Police Department, who shall have the power to approve, or disapprove, the location of any such stand, or the proposed operation thereat.

SECTION 5: It shall be unlawful for any person, firm, or corporation to sell, discharge, or use fireworks after the 4th of July of each year, to and including June 15th of the next succeeding year. It shall likewise be unlawful for any person, firm, or corporation to sell, use, or otherwise distribute fireworks without complying with the following:

(a) That the front of all fireworks stands shall be completely enclosed from the counter to the roof with wire screen netting not to exceed 12 mesh, except for a small opening to permit the prospective customer, and no person shall be allowed in the interior of the structure except those actually employed in the sale of fireworks.

(b) That all structures shall be erected under the supervision and guidance of the Building Department.

(c) That all persons employed to sell fireworks shall be over the age of twenty-one (21) years.

(d) That if in the judgment of the Chief of the Fire Department, or the Building Inspector, the construction of the fireworks stand, or the conduct of the operations therein, do not conform to the provisions of this Ordinance, or appear to be detrimental to the public interest, such officers may order said stands immediately closed.

(e) That all merchandise to be stored or displayed at a distance of not less than three feet from the front and side walls of the structure.

(f) That all stands be equipped with at least one fire extinguisher meeting the approval of the Fire Chief.

SECTION 6: Any violation of the provisions of this Ordinance shall be deemed a misdemeanor and any violator upon conviction thereof, shall be punished by a fine not to exceed Five Hundred Dollars (\$500), or by imprisonment in the City Jail of the City of Torrance for a term not to exceed 90 days.
