


# Marine Clerks Keep Pennant Drive Alive

## Sacramento Report

**Home Amount Upped**  
Senate Bill No. 784, introduced by Senator Nelson S. Dilworth, of Riverside County, increases from \$11,500 to \$12,500, in the case of the purchase of a home, the maximum value of real estate holdings a veteran may thereby have in order to receive the benefits under the Veterans' Farm and Home Purchase Act of 1943. This bill was approved by the Governor on April 23, 1953, and is now Chapter 355 of the Statutes of 1953.

**Tax Exemption**  
Any person who has participated in a campaign or an expedition for which a medal has been issued by the Congress of the United States is entitled to both civil service rights and tax exemption in California. Tax exemption for this classification is included in Section 214 of the Revenue and Taxation Code, and Civil Service preference is included in Section 18973 of the Government Code.

Until about two years ago there was some question about the rights of U. S. Marine Corps and U. S. Navy veterans of the Yangtze River and Nicaraguan Campaigns. In order to clear up any doubt, the so-called "Chapel amendments" were enacted into law. These spell out the names of all the wars and campaigns and then add a blanket clause which covers all wars, expeditions and campaigns for which Congress has issued medals.

**A-Bomb Protection**  
One of the many methods for protecting people from the effects of atomic bombs is the detection of the presence of nuclear radiation. An instrument called a "Radiation Alarm" is being marketed by the McKenna Laboratories, 2903 Main St., Santa Monica. It sounds an alarm when a gamma-ray radiation level exceeds the safe level. Although it is not a substitute for people, it does supplement human efforts. I present this information here at the request of several mayors and city councilmen.

**Crime Commission**  
My Assembly Concurrent Resolution No. 82, commending the Special Crime Study Commission on Organized Crime was unanimously passed by both houses of the California Legislature. It especially commends Governor Earl Warren for appointing the Commission and then commends all the members and the staff by name. One of the recommendations of the

**Crime Commission was a Gambling Abatement Law**

On May 18, 1953, when I read the final report of the Special Crime Study Commission on Organized Crime, I submitted my Assembly Bill No. 3523, which is a Gambling Abatement Law. Most people expressed surprise to find that California has no such law on its statute books. This gambling law is based upon the so-called "Red Light Abatement Law" of California which is very useful when an honest and fearless district attorney wants to stop prostitution. He can padlock the house, sell the personal property in the house at auction to meet any fine imposed in court, and then, if that does not meet the fine, he can sell the house at auction. This procedure, although rarely used, operates against the landlord as well as against the criminal and is very effective because it causes people to be more careful in selecting tenants and also makes them check up to be sure what is going on in their leased property.

My gambling abatement bill went through the Assembly without any trouble, but in the hearing before the Senate Judiciary Committee, the representatives of the public utilities complained that they did not want their equipment subject to the strict terms. For example, the telephone company did not want to lose its equipment.

Therefore, an amendment was made to meet these requests and the bill then went on the floor of the Senate. There a Senator got up and complained that the bill should go back to the Judiciary Committee for reworking.

**Truth Comes Out**  
When I went before the Senate Judiciary Committee for the second time, I said: "Gentlemen: If you want a gambling abatement act, I have one here which you can change to meet your requirements, if necessary, but if you are simply opposed to any kind of control of gambling, then please save your time and mine by saying so." The Senators laughed and admitted that they were not interested in such legislation but were surprised by my frankness. The bill died right there. This was no surprise to anyone who realizes that the California Senate is simply not interested in curtailing gambling. Remember, these are the same people who voted unanimously to adopt my Resolution commending the Crime Commission which had recommended the enactment of the gambling house abatement law!

During the past session, on an average day, I arrived at the office at 8:30 a.m.; read and answered mail until 9:30 a.m.; was on the floor voting until 12 noon; ate for one-half hour and listened to people who wanted something until 2 p.m.; was on the floor again until 3 p.m.; was in committee until 6 p.m.; ate for one-half hour; listened to people who wanted something until 8 p.m.; was in committee from 8 to 10 or 11 p.m.; answered mail until midnight or 1 a.m.; and then went home. When I had time to myself, I read newspapers to see what people were thinking. "There is no money in it, but it is fun, anyway!"

# Receive Bids For Alondra Addition

Two bids for additions to the \$15,300 for the addition, which Alondra Park comfort station will double the present capacity were received by the County Board of Supervisors this week.

Apparent low bidder was O. Pert & Forsberg, contractors of Gardena, who submitted a bid of \$15,300 for the addition, which will double the present capacity of the existing facility, according to Supervisor Burton W. Chace.

The building will be 12 by 24 feet in size, and will cover 408 square feet. The new structure will consist of a concrete block building with a storage room and water tank to be connected to the existing sewer line, as well as to the new comfort station.
