

Electric Edges Supply 3-2 In 8; Takes Full Game Lead on Carson

Motorcycle Card Set for Carrell
Carrell Speedway has been concentrating this week on tomorrow night's A.M.A. motorcycle race card of 14 events. No action is scheduled for Saturday evening with all hands working on the gigantic 100-lap URA Stock Car Championships set for the night of Saturday, July 25.
Tomorrow night the cycle fraternity have a wild and woolly card on tap. Rumored to be back in action is Big Bert Brundage, the scourge of the speedways last year. Bert has been out of action since he fractured his ankle late last season.
Target for the night will be the Battling Chuck Hasey, the famed Mighty Mite and motorcycle cyclist's Mean Man, who has been sweeping the Carrell cycle cards of late.

Cards Go Ahead By One Game in Little League
The Elks Cardinals shaped up as the team to beat in the Little Leagues following last week-end's games, which saw the Cards establish a firm hold on first place in league standings by trimming the Lions' Cubs 2-0 to give them a one-game lead over the Harvey Braves and Torrance Builders Giants, who are tied for second.
In a game played Sunday at the Little League Park, the Cards blanked the Cubs with one hit and Card pitcher Harty struck out 13 in a sterling mound performance.
In another Sunday game, the Pirates unlimbered their potent bats on three Builders' Giant pitchers in a 22-3 rout. The Pirates garnered 16 hits in the win.
On Saturday, the Braves beat the Dodgers and the Giants topped the Pirates, both by identical scores of 7-5.
Gary Desmond hit the first inside-the-park home run of the season to help his Harvey mates top the Dodgers, and pitcher Moore was the big gun for the Giants at the dish, with three for four.
The Giant-Pirate game was a rematch of a tie game played on June 30. This one also went into extra innings, with the Pirates getting two markers in the seventh to tie it up, and then the Giants collecting three runs in their half of the eighth inning to assure the victory.

League-leading National Electric barely managed to squeeze by cellar-dwelling National Supply 3-2 in an overtime game played Sunday at Torrance Park.
In fact, if it hadn't been for a high fly that Supply right fielder Gene Brown lost in the lights, they might be playing yet.
Opposing pitchers Hal Neims, for Electric, and Art Huntzman for Supply, had a real pitchers' duel on the fire going into the eighth, then Electric third baseman Jim Nady lofted a high one out to right which Brown couldn't find, and Nady went all the way to score the tie-breaker.
The win put National Electric a full game ahead of the Carson Merchants, but if the Merchants win their next two games, they can once again tie for first again, too into a tie game on July 23. The Merchants meet National Supply and Dow Chemical before that. A double win could put them back into a tie for first.
The real test will be when the Merchants and the Electric team clash on July 27.
The same Gene Brown who lost the fly ball started the rally which gave his team its lone run in the second inning. He got on base on an error, went to second on a passed ball, and scored when shortstop Chuck Keener banged a home run into center field.
Electric also scored in the second when Bill Dietlin got on an error, went to second on a fielder's choice, to third on Don Fulton's single, which loaded the bases, when Huntzman walked Don Merrell.
