Manhattan Beach Injection Test Ends In October

Continuance of the Manhattan Beach barrier test beyond mid-October is doubtful, since the available funds remaining in the \$750,000 state appropriation will last only until then, according to Carl Fossette, West Basin Water Association spokesman.

The final months of operation will entail 24-hour injection of water into seven wells spaced at 500-foot intervals. Reconditioning of some of the

walls to prevent the upsurge of injected water with the resultant cave-ins, will be undertaken by the State Division of Water Resources, upon a decision made by the State Water Resources Board at its last meeting.

Specifications are now being written and invitation for bids will soon be circulated. It is expected that the work will be completed next month and that all seven wells will be in operation by Sept. 1.
