


**SILVERWARE BASE**



## 'Threaten' Ump In Rip-Roaring Forfeited Game

One of the most rip-roaring games ever written into the Class "B" scorebooks will have to be stricken from the record this week because of a piddly little thing like an argument with an umpire.

The Walteria Merchants and the South Bay Church of God were the combatants in the wild-scoring game, in which the two teams battled to a 17-17 tie in the seventh inning, only to have the game given to South Bay Church because one of the Walteria players was booted for "threatening" the ump and the Merchants couldn't replace him, according to scorekeeper Red Moon.

Yea Bauer was the argumentative Walteria left fielder that got the hook. The umpire, after warning and ejecting Bauer, gave the game to the Church team by forfeit because Walteria could not field nine men.

Before the sad seventh, everything happened. Walteria started off the game by scoring nine runs on eight hits, two walks and three errors in their half of the first and then the Church team, undaunted, came right back to tally 10 runs in their half of the first on six hits, including a round-tripper by Tom LaFontaine, four walks, and three errors.

South Bay picked up six more in the third and fourth frames to take a 16-9 lead. They got their 17th run in the sixth. In the meantime, the Merchants were rampaging for eight runs in the last two innings to tie up the game, but their efforts went for naught.

It was the first win for the Church team, after 18 straight losses.

A three run surge in the last of the seventh fell just short of catching the Walteria BMA as the Harbor Hornets went down to a 13-12 defeat in another Class "B" fray Monday evening at Walteria.

## Stickley Hurls Perfect No Hitter; Retires 21 In Order

Don Stickley, National Electric fireball ace, reached his zenith Monday night.

In a Class "A" game against Dow Chemical, Stickley retired 21 men in order, hurling a no-hit, no-walk game in which no opposing batter reached first base, according to scorekeeper Dale Wickstrom.

National Electric fielders turned in yeoman duty to protect the no-hitter as Stickley struck out only two batters, the rest grounding or flying out.

The win moved Electric into third place in the league, two games in back of the first-place Carson Merchants. The Merchants drew a breather Monday night when National Supply failed to field a team, giving the league leaders a forfeit win.

Midland Rubber has three games left to play while Electric and the Merchants each play one more. Thus, National Electric is eliminated from the pennant race mathematically and the Herald perpetual trophy, which they now hold, will go to some other team this year.

If Midland Rubber manages to whip National Supply tonight, Dow Chemical Monday and the Marine Clerks next Thursday, and the Merchants win Monday, the league will end in a deadlock between the two teams. If Carson loses, and Midland takes all three, Midland takes the Herald trophy.

National Electric scoring Monday evening went as follows: In the second inning, Stickley singled and was sent to second on a safety by Don Fulmer. He went to third when the Dow shortstop miscued on Ernie Floyd's grounder, and scored on a fielder's choice.

In the third, Nick Dellan singled, went to second on a fielder's choice, stole third and scored on a single by Keith Harris.
