TORRANCE HERALD RESOLUTION NO. 838
A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TORRANCE DECLARING ITS INTENTION TO VACATE A PORTION OF THAT CERTAIN STREET DESIGNATED AS "PUT LITE STREET" IN TRACT 17965; FIXING A TIME WHEN THE CITY COUNCIL WILL MEET TO TAKE FINAL ACTION THEREON; AND PROVIDING FOR THE PUBLICATION OF THIS RESOLUTION.
The City Council of the City of Torrance does resolve as follows:
WHEREAS, the City Council has been petitioned to vacate a portion of that certain street designated as "Put Lite Street" in Tract 17965 within the City of Torrance, more particularly described as follows: to-wit: A strip of land three feet (3') in width lying along the Southern side of "Put Lite Street" as shown on Tract Map 17965 as recorded in Book 447, pages 18 to 21 in the County Recorder, County of Los Angeles, State of California, said strip of land extending from the Southeastern property line of Lot 75 to the Western property line of Lot 77 in said Tract 17965; and
WHEREAS, such vacation will cause no hardship of any kind to adjacent property owners; and
WHEREAS, the Planning Commission of the City of Torrance has recommended approval of said petition to vacate said portion of said street; and the said City Council hereby declares its intention to vacate when the portion of the street is hereby approved for the purpose of this proceeding and is hereby ordered filed in the Office of the City Clerk of the City of Torrance and marked "Filed September 8, 1953" and which map is hereby referred to for particulars as to the proposed vacation.
RESOLVED, that on the Sixth day of October, 1953 at eight o'clock p.m. of said day, a time and place fixed hereby, the City Council will meet to take final action hereon and which meeting the City Council will meet to make to the vacation of said portion of said street will be heard and objections made and voted are overruled; and in the event all objections made and voted are overruled, the City Council shall be deemed to have jurisdiction to order said portions of said street heretofore described to be vacated.
RESOLVED, that the City of Torrance reserves and accepts from the vacation all permanent easements and the right at any time, or from time

to time, to construct, maintain, operate, replace, remove and convey sanitary sewers and storm drains and appurtenant structures in, upon, over and across said street or any part thereof, and to construct, maintain, operate, replace, remove, renew and enlarge lines of pipe, conduits, cables, poles, and other convenient structures, equipment and fixtures for the operation of gas, electric, telephone and telegraph lines, and for the transportation or distribution of electric energy, petroleum and its products and water, including access and the right to keep the property free from inflammable materials and wooded growth, and otherwise protect the same from all hazards in, upon and over the portion of the street, or parts thereof, proposed to be vacated.
RESOLVED, that this Resolution be published once a week for at least three successive weeks prior to the day fixed herein for the meeting of the said City Council, in a newspaper of general circulation, to-wit: the Torrance Herald, published in the City of Torrance, and that this Resolution be conspicuously posted along the boundaries of the portion of street herein proposed to be vacated and not less than three hundred feet from the street, under and in pursuance of the provisions of the Street Vacation Act of 1941 (Chapter 250, Statutes of 1941) as amended, approved and adopted this 8th day of September, 1953.

TORRANCE HERALD RESOLUTION NO. 835
AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TORRANCE ESTABLISHING CERTAIN TRAFFIC CONTROL MEASURES PURSUANT TO ARTICLE IV, ORDINANCE NO. 446.
The City Council of the City of Torrance does ordain as follows:
That public convenience and necessity require that traffic control installations be established on certain streets in said City.
WHEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TORRANCE THAT THE FOLLOWING REGULATORY TRAFFIC SIGNS BE ESTABLISHED ON THE FOLLOWING STREETS:
1. Two-way STOP:
(a) On 22nd Street at Arlington Avenue.
(b) On Hickory Avenue at El Prado Street.
(c) On 17th Street at Erman Street.
2. Three-way STOP:
(a) At Madrona Avenue and El Prado Street.
3. Four-way STOP:
(a) At Windsor Drive and Blinwood Drive.
(b) At Windsor Drive and El Prado Street.
4. ONE-HOUR PARKING:
(a) On west side of Border Avenue between Carson Street and 21st Street.
The aforementioned regulatory signs have been authorized by the Traffic Commission as necessary, as per Ord-

inance No. 446, Article IV, and the City Traffic Chief, under said Ordinance and Article, is hereby authorized and directed to erect such signs. The City Council hereby declares that the increased usage by the automobile driving public of these streets has created a traffic hazard which demands the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety of all citizens traveling said streets, whether by automobile or on foot, broken bottles and other weapons which were confiscated and held for evidence.
The City Clerk shall certify to the passage and adoption of this Ordinance and cause the same to be published once in the Torrance Herald, a semi-weekly newspaper published, printed and circulated in the City of Torrance, and said newspaper is hereby designated for that purpose.
