

No Salvation in Matter Sunday's Lesson-Sermon

Salvation is not to be found in reliance on materiality but through spiritual understanding of God, good, declares the Sunday Lesson-Sermon on "Matter" in all Christian Science churches.

The Golden Text is from Hosea (1:7): "I will have mercy upon the house of Judah, and will have them by the Lord their God, and will not save them by bow, nor by sword, nor by battle, by horses, nor by horsemen."

In the Lesson-Sermon this famous statement from Zachariah (4:6) appears: "Not by might nor by power, but by my spirit, saith the Lord of Hosts." This follows the account of the instantaneous healing by Christ Jesus of the impotent man at the pool of Bethesda: "Jesus saith unto him, Rise, take up thy bed, and walk. And immediately the man was made whole, and took up his bed, and walked" (John 5:8, 9).

In "Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures" Mary Baker Eddy writes: "God is more to a man than his belief, and the less we acknowledge matter or its laws, the more immortality we possess. Consciousness constructs a better body when faith in matter has been conquered. Correct material belief by spiritual understanding and Spirit will form you anew" (p. 425).

Nab 11 Wetbacks In Federal Raid On Burner Plant

A raiding party of five Torrance policemen surrounded the Federal Burner Corp., 2341 Jefferson St., Thursday morning while three federal immigration officials went in and flushed out 11 wetbacks, some of whom were discovered hiding beneath red hot molds.

Torrance police participating in the raid were Sgt. Percy Bennett, Patrolmen Zelle Trease and Joe Miles, and reserve officers Bud Walsh and Bill King.

They blocked all the exits while the federal officers walked through the building picking up the illegal-entrants. The 11 wetbacks took to hiding when they saw the officers coming, some squeezing beneath red hot molds, which clear the ground by only about two feet.

The 11 wetbacks will be given time to pick up their belongings, then will be shipped back to their home country.

Seaman Returns From Korea Tour

James E. Taylor, seaman, USN, son of Mr. and Mrs. L. A. Taylor of 2908 Opal, will arrive in San Diego on Sept. 22 aboard the Navy destroyer USS John A. Bole, one of the few destroyers to complete three tours of duty in the Korean Theatre.

During the cruise the Bole saw action in Wonsan Harbor, North Korea, along the Korean coast with the battleship USS New Jersey and with Navy Fast Carrier Task Force 77 in the Sea of Japan. While in Wonsan Harbor the ship qualified for combat pay—an additional \$45 per man—having been taken under fire six days during the month of June. On each occasion the enemy guns were silenced.

During their third tour in the Far East the Bole visited ports in Japan, Hong Kong, China, Formosa, Midway and Pearl Harbor.

Pelvis, Both Legs Broken In Accident

Reported in slightly improved condition yesterday at Gardena Hospital was Vernon Burns, 16, of 1835 W. 169th St., who sustained a broken pelvis and fractures of both legs Monday when he fell beneath a fork-lift loaded with bricks at the Higgins Brick and Tile Co., 2217 W. 174th St.

Burns was trying to jump onto the fork-lift while it was moving, slipped, and fell beneath the wheels, according to police records.

He was given plasma at Park Emergency Hospital Monday and Hospital. He was put in traction, and presently is resting with a cast supporting the pelvic injury and casts on each leg.
