

Joint Recreation Plan To Be Tested

An experimental recreation program, testing whether the city schools and the Recreation Department can work hand in hand to provide after-school play facilities for children, will be begun on a local school ground soon, according to Harry Van Belleham, city recreation director.

In this "pilot program," Van Belleham said, a supervisor from the Recreation Department will be sent to a certain school after it has closed for the day. He will then supervise children's play, using the school's equipment.

Van Belleham believes that, if a working agreement can be reached, capital expenditures for playgrounds in the city will be reduced because the facilities that are already available on school grounds can be used, rather than building new playgrounds.

This will eliminate buying two slides, or building two ball diamonds where you need only one," Van Belleham explained.

The joint program will provide a place where children can

play after school under supervision and in safety. Facilities for all sorts of sports—softball, touch football, etc.—plus crafts will be provided for children.

Details of the joint program that still have to be worked out include responsibilities, where they lie, and where the dividing line between Recreation Department responsibility and a school responsibility will fall.

If the "pilot program" proves to be a success, the plan will be extended to all school playgrounds in the area. If no children turn out to take part in the program, however, the plan will be dropped, Van Belleham said.
