

## Huge New Home Development in P.V. Hills Told

of removing the DE. The distance earth which is used as a filtering agent in scores of processes is in layers extending to a depth of 100 feet in the second highest hill in the Peninsula. A trench will be cut into the top of the hill, the DE removed from the dirt, and leaded into trucks for transportation down a road to be located in the bottom of a canyon which flows into Water. The dirt would be put back into the trench after removal of the DE, Marlett said. The final result, claims Marlett, is that the top of the hill will be lowered 15 feet. It is to be heavily camouflaged with trees surrounding the entire operation. Because it is on the crest of a hill and the operation is to be carried on as though it were inside a volcano plus the screening of the site by trees will make the operation "invisible" to future residents in the development. He said that there would be little or no dust problem since the DE is 60 per cent moisture. A "wet mining" technique would be followed, the company spokesman said.

funds to be received from the state, if the census shows the city to have a population of more than 40,000, the city may request special consideration from the Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors to establish a municipal court here. At the present time, Torrance police must take all arrested persons before the South Bay Justice Court in Redondo Beach each day, entailing considerable expense in transportation and time of the officers.

Special efforts to publicize the census are being undertaken by George Powell, assistant to the city manager. Powell has asked that business establishments and others help in making the dates of the census known so the most accurate and complete count obtainable can be recorded on the census.

Enumerators with a knowledge of their community or neighborhood who will be able to devote eight hours a day for one week are requested to send their name, address, phone number, and the year they moved to Torrance to Special Census, City Hall, Torrance, Calif.

A special census here early in

1952 showed Torrance then had a population exceeding 34,000. The 1950 census gave the city credit for slightly more than 22,000 residents.

The 1953 special census should turn up at least 41,000 residents—and could go higher, officials say.
