

# Wholesale Turnover In Prophet's Ranks

Worlds collided and prophets fell after Torrance's 41-6 win over Baldwin Park Friday night.

A wholesale turnover in the Soothsayer's chain of command saw former A-No. One Wizard Jack Baldwin plummeting from first to second place behind Milt "Brain" Isbell; and Mary "Stretch Drive" Hall leaping from fifth to third place by choosing Torrance by 26 points. He traded places with Chief J. H. "Conservative" Stroh.

Confusion seems to be reigning over the method used to rank the Herald prognosticators. Herewith, let it be dispelled. The prophets choose the team they think will win by the number of points they think it will win by. Then, the difference between the actual number of points and their guess is tallied, and they are penalized that many points.

For example: Hall picks Torrance to beat Beverly Hills by 14 points. If Torrance wins by 14, he gets zero.
