American-Standard Plant Workers Contribute 100 Per Cent to Chest

Employees of the American Radiator and Standard Sanitary Corp. plant here joined the ranks of hundred percenters this week as the 1953 Community Chest Campaign in the plant received a contribution from each of the company's 269 employees.

In announcing the 100 per cent participation of the employees, Plant Manager H. W. Creger congratulated Raymond Corberly, president of Potters Local 218, and leaders of the union who put over the drive.

"Officials and members of Local 218, International Brotherhood of Operative Potters, AFL, enthusiastically cooperated with the management of the plant in the solicitation of employees for the Community Chest," Creger said.

Final results at the plant show the employees contributed a total of \$1287.50 which represents an average contribution of \$4.71 per employee.

Last year's campaign in the plant hit 96 per cent and an average contribution of \$4.47, according to Don Anderson, personnel officer at the plant.

Gardens Tract To Get Sewers

In answer to a petition from 239 of 361 homeowners in the Sepulveda Gardens tract, the City Council has approved the formation of a sewer district for the tract, George Stevens, city manager, announced this week.

The County Health Department has declared that the cesspools now in use in the tract are inadequate.


City Engineer Ronald Bishop has been directed to prepare plans and specifications for the sewer system.
