Magic Carpet of Words Whisks Local Y Through Turkey, India, Egypt

Whisking them on a magic carpet of words, Mrs. Gilbert Myers took Harbor District YWCA members through the YW's in Istanbul, Beirut, Cairo, and Bombay when an "International Evening" was held at the San Pedro YW in celebration of World Fellowship Week.

In Istanbul, Mrs. Myers said, who have left home to work in the city to stay.

In April, while the local YW Service Center as Turkey is a Mohammedan country and government will not permit the word Christian in the title. In these centers, one of which was just opened last Oct. 16, girls are trained to be secretaries. The American Service Center is the only place in Istanbul where this training is offered, and here classes are given in Turkish, French, and English to prepare the girl for the particular office in which she will work. Every girl who is trained is placed.

This YW also operates a camp and offers cooking and conversational language groups as well as operating a center for the undernourished. One of the centers in the area operates a hotel with several rooms for transients.

In Beirut, the YW maintains vocational schools for over 300 girls, and these schools are the only places in the city where girls can live away from home, Mrs. Myers said. "The Beirut girls, through their secretary, Darothes McDowell, to tell you how much they appreciate the help which comes through the World Fellowship Fund," she continued.

A cafeteria and hostel for business girls are also featured at the YWCA in Cairo, Mrs. Myers said, for here, as in Beirut, there are no places for young girls.

Mrs. Louis Ladra, chairman of the Harbor Area World Fellowship committee, welcomed the group and explained the purpose of World Fellowship Week. To set the tone of the meeting, Mrs. Nishimoto, accompanied by Mrs. Robert Corfield, sang "Kashmiri Song" by Woodford Finley and "Song of India" by Rimski-Korsakoff.

Mrs. Myers will speak again at the Torrance Y's Christmas Festival of Nations, slated for Friday, Dec. 11, 7:30 p.m., at the local YWCA. Mrs. Phelan Foley, local World Fellowship chairman, is in charge of arrangements.
