

Leo Harvey Urges Titanium Expansion

A four-point program to develop titanium resources was outlined by Leo M. Harvey, president of Harvey Machine Co., before a Senate subcommittee this week.

Speaking to the subcommittee on materials, minerals, and resources, Harvey said, "It is essential for the United States to have a titanium program of wider horizons than the present planned expansion goal for an annual output of 250,000 tons in 1956."

The vital metal is used in construction of military planes, he

The metal is especially used in jet planes because it can withstand temperatures up to 700 degrees Fahrenheit, while aluminum, now used in aircraft construction, withstands heat well only at temperatures up to 250 degrees.

Program Outlined

Harvey's program includes the promotion of exploration for titanium and for its recovery, research on titanium production,

from Australia, but since then sources have been found in several states including New York, Florida, Virginia, and North Carolina.
