**After 22 Years**

**Navy Lieutenant Tries Land Legs**

After 22 years of service with the U.S. Navy, Lt. Bob Baldwin of 1609 Elm Ave. has left the seafaring life for a salesman's job, affiliating with Joseph N. Burton Realty at the main office, 2468 Torrance Blvd.

The local man joined the Navy in Yakima, Wash., Aug. 23, 1932, as an apprentice seaman. He served as an enlisted man until 1943, when he was commissioned a lieutenant, and retired from the service on June 1. Lt. Baldwin, who also served in the revolution in Cuba in 1933 and 1934, was aboard the flagship of the Asiatic fleet in 1938 when the Panay was sunk by the Japanese. He was with President Roosevelt when he met Churchill in the North Atlantic the first time.

With the invading forces in Africa in 1942, he later went out to the Pacific to serve with Admiral Halsey and Admiral Spruance in Task Force 38 and 58, aboard the battleship New Jersey, which was the flagship of the fleet.

While serving on this vessel, Lt. Baldwin earned 11 battle stars.

The retired Navyman's last tour of duty was with Rear Admiral J. M. Will, commander of the Amphibious Group, Western Pacific, where he was communications officer. He also spent two tours of duty in Korea.






