SAFETY OF SKIN DIVERS SOUGHT BY SUPERVISORS

Alarmed by the rising number of deaths of "skin divers," Supervisor Burton W. Chace has proposed a two-fold program to curb this trend, here this week.

This program includes a continuation of the educational program already begun by the Department of Parks and Recreation, and establishment of control measures governing the sale of skin diving equipment. Chace said his information was that a number of deaths had been due to faulty equipment. Other supervisors agreed, unanimously instructing the County director of parks and recreation to meet with the sheriff's office and the County Council to devise a safety control plan for the diver devices. An average of more than one death per month has been recorded so far this year, Chace said.

Lomita High Schooler Wins Prize; Still Loses Money

James Balcom came out of the annual Fisher Body Craftsman's Guild model competition with a net loss of \$18, even though he won honorable mention and a \$25 war bond.

The 15-year-old Narbonne High School student, son of Mr. and Mrs. O. R. Balcom, 26001 Eshelman Ave., Lomita, won the prize for a hardtop convertible design he entered in the junior division of the contest. The model cost \$40 to build.

It was the first model for the youth, who heard about the contest through his high school. He was encouraged to enter by his industrial arts teacher. Before that time, he had done little work with models. The model took about six months to build, he said.

Balcom plans to enter the contest again next year, in the hope that he can win one of the eight university scholarships offered 98 grand national awards. He plans to enter a college, as yet undetermined, to study engineering.






