Growth of California Newspapers Noted in 27th Annual Directory

Reader interest and acceptance of California newspapers are the highest in the 108-year-old history of the business. This is revealed in the 27th annual edition of the California Newspaper Directory and Rate Book being distributed nationally today by the California Newspaper Publishers Assn.

Net paid circulation of CNPA member newspapers is shown as 5,272,604 as against 2,191,453 ten years ago.

"Taking the age-old formula of four readers to a subscription, this means that 20,000,000 readers are served by California's newspapers," declares President Grady Setzler, publisher of the Palo Verde Valley Times at Blythe. "This is a sure index that newspapers continue to be the major mass medium of information in spite of modern complexity of the competition for the readers' time."

600 Papers Listed

The 70-page volume of this directory contains the latest and most accurate statistical information of all of the more than six hundred newspapers in the state, as well as CNPA members in Arizona, Nevada, Oregon, Alaska, Hawaii, and the Philippines.

This statistical information includes the name of the city of publication, population, county, name of the newspaper, date of its establishment, name of the publisher, number of the court decree as a newspaper of general circulation, day of issue, subscription rates, circulation figures, and mechanical information.

Features Noted

Individual features of individual newspapers in their fast-growing communities in display ads are an added feature of the volume.

CNPA members total 429, of which 311 are weeklies, and 118 are dailies—from the largest metropolitan giant to the smallest country newspapers in the remote mountains, valleys, and desert.


