

Theme Revealed For Recreation Open House Fete

"Hi-Lites of '54" will be the theme when the Recreation Department's annual Open House program hits the Civic Auditorium Saturday.

The theme was selected because only the outstanding portions of the program can be shown that night. Some of the outstanding features of the program will be the craft display from all of the playground areas, the talent show, staged with children from all of the areas, the selection and crowning of the "King and Queen of Health," and colored slides of the summer recreation activities.

The craft display, made up of completed craft projects from the 13 summer playground areas, will be open to the public from 2 p.m. to 6 p.m., and from 6 p.m. to 9:30 p.m. on Saturday. The Talent Show will be from 8 p.m. to 9 p.m. Saturday night.

Judging in Morning
Judging of the craft display will be Saturday morning, and the ribbon awards will have been made before the show is open to the public so that all may see which projects have won. The award to the playground for the best over-all display will be made just before the big talent show that night.

Many Torrance merchants have contributed prizes for the winners of the talent show, and judges selected from the Recreation Commission will be on hand Saturday night to pick the best talent on the show.

To Show Slides
Another new feature of the Open House program will be the showing of 48 colored views of the Torrance Summer Recreation Program. The pictures that were taken of the program this summer will be shown on an automatic projector at the front of the Civic Auditorium. Pictures of the Walteria Circus will be displayed, as well as pictures of the softball games, summer picnic games, craft program, teenage square dance, Torrance Park Band Shell programs, etc.

The King and Queen of Health will be selected by a Torrance doctor only after a physical examination has been given all contestants from the local playgrounds.

Playgrounds To Close
All of the school playgrounds will close Friday, Aug. 27, and only the park playgrounds will remain open with a staff of recreation leaders until Sept. 3. The Torrance Recreation Department is proud of the program it presented to the people of Torrance this summer, and they invite everyone in Torrance to come to the Open House Program so that they may see what was done. The Recreation Department particularly wants to thank all the merchants that contributed prizes to the Open House Program and to the other activities carried on by the Department during the summer months.
