


Two Local Drivers Speed To Victory at Bonneville



BUILT FOR SPEED . . . It doesn't look much like a Model T Ford or a 1925 Chevrolet, but Duane Steele's modified roadster started as an alliance of the two—with modern additions of course. The modern additions enabled Steele to zip across the Bonneville Salt Flats last week at 121.45 miles per hour to win first place in his class and bring home the trophy he holds, above.

Bishop Sets New Record, Steele Wins

A pair of Torrance drivers who throttled their irons across the Bonneville Salt Flats last week came away laden with gold.

Duane Steele, 24, of 1320 Cota Ave., son of the late Carl Steele, long-time member of the Board of Education, was awarded a first place trophy for pushing his Class "A" modified roadster across the salt at 121.45 miles per hour. Steele took first place in his class on the two-and-a-quarter mile course.

Bishop Repeats
The other winner is Don Bishop, of 1541 W. 218th St., a repeater from last year, who set a new record in the "D" competitive coupe class. Bishop set a new standard in the same class last year at Bonneville when he burned the rubber at a 100.852 mile per hour clip.

Both drivers are members of the Albata Car Club, a member club in the Southern California Timing Association, which sponsors the Bonnie races.

It was the third win this year for Steele. He took firsts at the Dry Lakes in June and July in the same car, hitting 124 and 120 mph on his speedometer.

Strange Wedding
Steele's auto shows what can be done by mating a 1925 Chevrolet with a 1927 Model T Ford.

Starting with the Chevy block, the young Douglas Aircraft worker added such refinements as Cadillac valves, a Ford crankshaft, a Winfield cam, and Oldsmobile three-port head, Mallory ignition and a fuel injection system that uses pure alcohol.

Steele is looking forward to two more lake meets—and two more good chances for first place trophies—one on Sept. 26 and another in October.

More than 300 cars and 1000 people attended the recent Bonneville get-together.




