Fun for Boys and Girls

I have a new recipe for starch paint. Try it and see if you don't consider it the best you've ever used.

Mix three tablespoons of laundry starch in one cup of water. Stir it (Figure 1) until it is creamy smooth with no lumps. Next, mix two table-

spoons of white soap flakes in half a cup of water, stirring until the soap has dissolved.

Pour the two mixtures together into a pan. Select a wax crayon of the color you want the starch paint to be. Place the crayon in the mixture, then set the pan on the stove. At this point let Mother take over. She should bring the mixture to a boil, stirring it constantly so it doesn't burn or become lumpy.

When the concoction has cooked to the thickness of cornstarch pudding, contains no lumps and the color is even, she should pour it into a bowl to cool.

When cool, the mixture will be like a firm paste. It is then ready to use.

Apply it to glossy paper; the bottom of a candy box is perfect. Spread the paste on the paper with your fingers. If it is too dry to go on smoothly, add a little water to it.

Spread the paste over the paper with your hands until there are no lumps. Then draw a picture with your fingers, the teeth of a comb (Figure 2), the tines of a fork or any other object that will make an unusual design.

You can make a chrysanthemum by forming a tangle of loops with your fingernails. For leaves skid the side of your thumb in curves on the paper. The pictures you make will be good enough to hang on the wall of your room.

One of the good things about my recipe is that the starch paint won't stain your hands and will wash off easily.
