

City Stops Registering Of Picnics

The Torrance Recreation Department will no longer accept calls from groups planning to use picnic facilities in various city parks, Director Harry Von Bellehann announced yesterday. The city has grown too large to continue keeping a calendar record of all large groups planning to use picnic facilities at various parks, he said. This practice was designed to prevent several groups in a park on one day. "It just isn't possible to schedule the picnic groups so that they will all have as much room and facilities as they need," Von Bellehann said. "Unfortunately some of the people have misinterpreted our courtesy service in regard to picnic scheduling, and have thought that we were granting an exclusive picnic reservation to their group. This has never been the case, nor will it be in the future," he explained. Now, as in the past, park facilities will be available on a first-come, first-served basis, he said.

Officer Says Arrested Man Spat in Face

A man who allegedly spat in the face of a Highway Patrolman has pleaded not guilty in South Bay Municipal Court to charges that he drove without a license, was driving while drunk, and exceeded the speed limit. Captain F. F. Simmons, of the Highway Patrol, chased the man for some distance and apprehended Vernon Irving Schlemmer, 36, of Gardena, on Sept. 4 near 190th and Orenshaw Blvd. On the way to the Torrance Police Station and at the station, Schlemmer spit on him several times, Simmons said.

Schlemmer was freed on \$525 bond, after pleading not guilty. He demanded a court trial, which will be held tomorrow. No charges were filed for the spitting incident. A female companion pleaded guilty to charges of drunkenness.

Growing Feet Need Proper Fit in Shoes

With youngsters getting back from camp, or just a summer in the backyard, it's time to check their footwear in preparation for the new school term. Foot defects among school-agers often stem from lack of proper footwear.

And since children develop differently, the only safe rule for all is to make sure that the new shoes fit accurately and are of flexible leather, to provide sufficient support for arches and to keep toes from cramping.

Here are things parents should keep in mind:

- (1) Is your child large for his age? Bones and muscles develop according to age and not height. Strength of the foot may be lagging behind size. He will need lightweight shoes, with leather of more than normal pliability.
- (2) Your child may be small for his age, but with fat bones and muscles more maturely developed. He will take a sturdier leather shoe than the boy or girl of average height.
- (3) A chubby girl or boy has a predisposition to "weak foot," say podiatrists, because of the strain of extra weight. Their shoes need plenty of spread-room at the toes, to prevent cramping of muscles.
- (4) An underweight or wiry child generally has a long, bony foot whose ligaments tend to looseness. Such feet elongate easily. Measure size of shoes in a standing position. To assure good heel-to-ball fit, make sure that the break of the leather comes exactly at the big toe joint.
