Mrs. Maude Armstrong
Funeral services for Mrs. Maude Armstrong, mother of Donald R. Armstrong, prominent Torrance attorney, will be held at 2 p.m. tomorrow in Redlands where she died Friday morning following a short illness.

Mrs. Armstrong, widow of John Armstrong, a former mayor of Whittier and one of the early builders of Ontario, was born in Springfield, Mo., in 1870 and came to California in 1897. In addition to Attorney Armstrong, she is survived by one son, Douglas, a former state assemblyman who has resided on an orange ranch in Redlands. A third son, Wilbur, died last February.

Mrs. Armstrong remained in good health until two weeks ago when she suffered a stroke. She retained an avid interest in local and world events and had a wide circle of friends in the Whittier and Redlands communities.

Mrs. Armstrong had an unusual educational career for a woman of her generation. She was a graduate of Baker university in Mississippi, the University of Kansas and, in later years, took special graduate courses at U.S.C. Her forebears traced their ancestry to the first census of North Carolina and members of the family served in every war of the United States, including the Revolution. An uncle came to California before the days of the Gold Rush.

Services have been set for 2 p.m. tomorrow at the Cortez Funeral Home.

WHEREAS, there has been filed with the City Council of the City of Torrance a petition signed by a qualified number of said city in number in excess of ten per cent (10%) of the number of voters cast in said city at the last general election for the purpose of calling for the election of a special election to be held in the City of Torrance, California, on the 19th day of October, 1954, for the purpose of submitting to the qualified voters of said city two propositions of a certain municipal improvement, to-wit: the acquisition and construction of certain municipal improvements and making findings relating thereto; and WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Torrance, California, did on the 31st day of August, 1954, by a vote of more than two-thirds of the members of said City Council adopt Resolution No. 2625 entitled "Resolution of the City Council of the City of Torrance, California, relating to the acquisition and construction of certain municipal improvements and making findings relating thereto; and WHEREAS, said resolution was duly signed and approved by the Mayor of said city and attached thereto by the City Clerk of said city; and WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Torrance DOES ORDAIN as follows:

Section 1. That a special municipal election be held, and the same is hereby called to be held, in the City of Torrance, California, on the 19th day of October, 1954, for the purpose of submitting to the qualified voters of said city two propositions of a certain municipal improvement, to-wit: the acquisition and construction of certain municipal improvements and making findings relating thereto; and WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Torrance, California, did on the 31st day of August, 1954, by a vote of more than two-thirds of the members of said City Council adopt Resolution No. 2625 entitled "Resolution of the City Council of the City of Torrance, California, relating to the acquisition and construction of certain municipal improvements and making findings relating thereto; and WHEREAS, said resolution was duly signed and approved by the Mayor of said city and attached thereto by the City Clerk of said city; and WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Torrance DOES ORDAIN as follows:

Section 2. That the estimated cost of the municipal improvement described in Bond Proposition No. 1 in Section 2 hereof is the sum of seven hundred thousand dollars (\$700,000) and that the amount of the principal of such indebtedness to be incurred therefor is the sum of seven hundred thousand dollars (\$700,000).

Section 3. That the estimated cost of the municipal improvement described in Bond Proposition No. 2 in Section 2 hereof is the sum of two hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$250,000) and that the amount of the principal of such indebtedness to be incurred therefor is the sum of two hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$250,000).

Section 4. That the maximum rate of interest to be paid on any indebtedness incurred for any of the purposes stated in this ordinance shall not exceed the maximum rate permitted by law, to-wit, six per cent (6%) per annum, payable in semi-annual payments, the actual rate of interest to be determined at the time of the sale of such bonds.

Section 5. That if any proposition for the incurring of bonded indebtedness so submitted receives the requisite number of votes, to-wit, two-thirds of the votes of the qualified voters of said city, the City Council of the City of Torrance, California, shall thereupon, by a vote of more than two-thirds of the members of said City Council, cause to be prepared and printed a set of seven o'clock A.M. of the day of said election and shall remain open continuously from said time to the close of the polls on the day of said election, except as provided in Section 5734 of the Elections Code of the State of California.

Section 6. That the City Council of the City of Torrance, California, in addition to any other matters required by law, shall thereupon be printed substantially the following:

Section 7. That the City of Torrance incur a bonded indebtedness in the principal amount of \$950,000 for the purpose of the acquisition and construction by said city of a certain municipal improvement, to-wit: a heating, water heating and purification facilities, including the planting and landscaping of grounds and provision for vehicle parking, and the acquisition of all land, furniture, equipment and other property necessary therefor.

Section 8. A cross (+) placed in the voting square after the word "YES" in the manner hereinafter provided shall be counted in favor of the adoption of a proposition. A check (✓) placed in the voting square after the word "NO" in the manner hereinafter provided shall be counted against the adoption of a proposition.
