Here's how Mrs. Murphy makes her most delicious dessert.

- LEMON PARFAIT PIE**
- 1 Pkg. Lemon gelatin
 - 1 Tablespoon Lemon Juice
 - 1 Cup Boiling Water
- Mix above and let set for whipping. 3 eggs - separate the whites from the yolks. To the beaten whites add 1/4 cup of sugar. Beat the yolks. Beat the jello. To the beaten jello fold in the beaten yolks. Then fold in the beaten whites. Pour the mixture into a graham cracker crust made as follows:
- 15 Graham Crackers
 - 1/4 Cup Sugar
 - 1/4 Cup Butter
- Crush graham crackers, mix with sugar and butter then cover bottom of pie pan. Place in the refrigerator. One hour before serving cover the top with whipped cream.
