

Vance Hayes, Veteran Director, to Lead 'Messiah' on Dec. 5

A Manhattan Beach man who directed the Army Chapel Choir of Fort Totten, N. Y. in presenting "The Messiah" at the age of 16, will direct the massed choirs of Torrance in Handel's famous oratorio on Dec. 5.

Vance Hayes, director of music at St. Clement's Episcopal Church in Huntington Park and voice instructor, will conduct the 150-voice choir at the First Baptist Church. A graduate of the School of Sacred Music of Union Theological Seminary in New York, he has studied pipe organ, composition, choir training, and conducting with many of the country's leading musicians.

Before coming to California three years ago, Hayes was first conductor of the Ars Musica Guild in Flushing, N. Y., for college-age young people. He founded similar groups in Brooklyn, N. Y., and Richmond, Va., and formed the Sylvan Singers, an octette known nationally during the 1930s.

He is a former permanent conductor with Eastern oratorio societies and has been guest conductor with several choral and oratorio societies. He has written "The Singer—the Man and His Art" and "To Him a New Song."

Soloists for the performance, chosen from local voices, will be announced next week. Hayes has said.

Eternal Life Sunday Topic

Maintaining man's eternal likeness to God brings freedom from discord and disease, says the Sunday Lesson-Sermon on "Mortals and Immortals" in all Christian Science churches.

The Golden Text from John (3:9) reads, "That which is born of the flesh is flesh; and that which is born of the Spirit is spirit." It is related in The Acts (28: 3-9) that when Paul was shipwrecked on the island of Melita, "there came a viper out of the heat, and fastened on his hand. And when the barbarians saw that he shook off the beast into the fire, and felt no harm... they said that he was a god." When he had healed the father of Publius of a fever, "others also, which had diseases in the island, came, and were healed."

In "Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures" Mary Baker Eddy declares, "Sin, sickness, and death must disappear to give place to the facts which belong to immortal man." Then she counsels, "Learn this, O mortal, and earnestly seek the spiritual status of man, which is outside of all material selfishness" (p. 476).
