New Miraleste Knolls Home To Be Open This Week-end

Furnished by Frank Bros. of Long Beach, with unusual imported showpieces of Swedish and Danish contemporary furniture, this Contemporary Rambler home will be open for inspection this week-end at 1911 Emilia Pl., in the new Miraleste Knolls district, located at the top of Ninth St. where it joins Miraleste Ave., between Rolling Hills, Palos Verdes, and San Pedro.

In planning this and other homes in the Miraleste Knolls section, Architect Edward A. Fickett, AIA, took into consideration the gently rolling knolls which provide homesites overlooking an inspirational panorama of San Pedro's famous Cabrillo Beach, the Yacht Harbor, the great Port of Los Angeles, and the ships at sea steaming into the harbor, while still providing homes in the \$10,000 to \$18,000 bracket on FHA terms.

The McCarthy Co., pioneer Southland builders since 1892, retained the services of Garrett Eckbo, well-known landscape architect, to lay out the garden areas so as to provide a lush, tropical Hawaiian entry patio featuring a "coffee-hour" table for the housewife to entertain her neighbors in the morning.

The huge living-recreation-dining area, instead of being separated by ceiling-height walls, has clever screens and planters to allow all of the living area to connect with the paved patio area for indoor-outdoor California living. The master bedroom, with its own private bath and stall shower, also overlooks the rear patio area through a wall of glass.

The Miraleste Knolls area can be reached by driving south on Western Ave. to Ninth St. in San Pedro, turn right to the west on Ninth St. and go to the top of Ninth St. on the high-land overlooking the ocean.
