

Thanksgiving Day turkey eaters will be a heap happier, this afternoon, if the El Camino Warriors come through with a win over the potent Bakersfield Renegades in a mix to decide the Metropolitan Conference king.

Kick-off has been set for high noon at the local stadium,

to enable rooters to still have plenty of time the rest of the day for traditional holiday festivities.

Bakersfield, rated the No. 1 joyces team of the nation, will come onto the field bound and determined to keep their top spot, and mindful that the winner of the turkey-tussle will be hot on the list of those to get a Little Rose Bowl nod.

The Renegades will be seeking their 25th straight win, while the Warriors will be looking for their ninth, although they brag of 22 wins in their last 25 games.

Both Teams Tops

Both squads are expected to go into this grid battle at full strength, although Bakersfield mentor Homer Beatty is a little concerned about Pat Mills, starting quarter back, who came away from their last tilt with a badly sprained ankle.

Shank Mills be grounded, Carl Gordon will move from his left halfback position to the field general's job.

Gordon, who leads the league in point-making (with 74 counters), had to take over the quarterback slot in the Santa Monica C.C. clash and ran for three touchdowns and passed to another.

El Camino also boasts a few of its own All-Metro material, namely in Joe Contestable and Stan Becker, two fair-haired boys who can run, pass, kick and block with the best of 'em.

Although East Los Angeles' hulking linemen fairly well sewed up Joe in last week's outing, he still claims four touch-down passes, and 22 pass completions for 42 tries, netting 237 yards in conference competition.

In the backfield for the El Camino crew, other than the qb's, are Geri Wight and Don Greco, a couple of speedsters. Don Kulpaca, Roger Motover, Dick Tiberio, and several others who have filled up big yardage gains on the turf.

Baldwin Park, second place winners of the San Gabriel Valley League, were nosed out by Covina, while Centennial was unmatched in conference play.

Santa Monica, who knocked over Torrance last week to capture second place in the Bay circuit, will match wits at Riverside in a lower-bracket elimination game.

Riverside copped the Citrus Belt League with six victories and no losses.

In individual CIF scoring, Gary Campbell of Whittier was top man with 20 touchdowns, and a single conversion to give him 121 points for the season. High man in the Bay League was Centennial's Paul Lowe, with 60 points.

Centennial ran up more points against league foes than any other school in the CIF, with 174 points. Next was Santa Monica, 159, and Cathedral in the Catholic circuit, 155.

The Apaches were nosed out only by Manual Arts High, with 162, in combined City-CIF total.
