Carson Area To Seek More Protection

"The growth of the Carson district makes it imperative to provide adequate health services and police protection to residents here," John G. Caldwell, president of the Carson Civic Betterment Assn. said yesterday. The statement came as an announcement of the organization's next meeting Jan. 3 at the Caldwell home 22120 Monte Ave. Time is 7:30 p.m., and the meeting is open to the public. Caldwell said that the association will request consolidation of the Sheriff's Department and Health Department in the area. Presently, services from two jurisdictions serve the Carson district, divided by Main St.

Those residing east of Main are served by the Compton Health Office and the Firestone Sheriff's district; those west of Main are in the Torrance Health district, and the Lennox Sheriff's jurisdiction.

Only local service now provided by the Health Department, Caldwell said, is a visiting well-baby clinic which is at the Carson St. School twice a month.

Smog Grows; Name Shorter

Because the smog problem is getting bigger, the Southern California Air Pollution Foundation has shortened its name. The board of trustees last week voted to drop "Southern California" from the title, Chairman Raymond B. Allen said, because "solution of smog and air pollution in Los Angeles is more than a local problem." Los Angeles, he pointed out, still is the nation's leading smog area, and will continue to receive the undivided attention of the foundation.
